Specific Course Goals

1. Given instruction students will be able to demonstrate their understanding of safety for people and dairy animals
2. Given instruction students will be able to understand how dairy animals sense their environment and learn from it
3. Given instruction students will be able to move animals in efficient manner – AI/chute/show/injections/herding
4. Given instruction students will be able to calm a restrained cow AI/chute/show/injections/herding
5. Given instruction students will articulate the positive effect of low-energy handling on animal and humane welfare
6. Given instruction students will present themselves as being an efficient dairy animal handler anywhere/anytime

Individuals completing the course learn how large animals sense the environment, including people, the triggers that result in adverse reactions, and low-energy handling techniques. Through hands-on experience beginning with young farm animals the students recognize the importance of body posture and human emotional control when dealing with farm animals. The student will be able to immediately apply their knowledge of animal behavior to herd livestock, sort animals from herds, safely capture animals, assess the character of the target animal, halter, lead, tether young-stock, and be able to safely approach and examine the animal.
